### *Feast of Don Bosco*

On 31 January, the Church celebrates the Feast of St John Bosco (Don Bosco), founder of the Salesian religious order to which our parish priests and brothers belong.

Born in Italy in 1815, Don Bosco died in 1888 and was canonised in 1934. Inspired by the kindness and gentleness of St Francis de Sales (whose feast day was 24 January), he dedicated his life to the education and care of young people, especially the poor.

This weekend, at all our Masses, we will reflect on Don Bosco's life in the light of the Word of God and pray in a special way for the Salesian Family and for young people throughout the world.

### *Seeking the Lord, Integrity, and Humility: Don Bosco's Prophetic Witness*

During his final visit to Rome for the consecration of the Church of the Sacred Heart, the *Memoirs of Don Bosco* recount a deeply moving moment in Don Bosco's life. On 16 May 1887, while celebrating the Eucharist in the newly completed church, he stopped and wept no fewer than fifteen times. When he finally regained his composure, Don Viglietti, his secretary, gently asked what had stirred such emotion. Don Bosco replied, "I had before my eyes the scene when I was ten years old and dreamt of the Congregation. I could actually see and hear my mother and brothers questioning the dream."

The *Memoirs* goes on to recall the words Our Lady spoke to him in that childhood dream: "*In due time you will understand everything.*"

After sixty-two years of tireless labour, sacrifice, and struggle, Don Bosco recognised in the completion of the Church of the Sacred Heart, the fulfilment of the mission that had quietly guided him since his youth. From his humble beginnings in "the Becchi di Castelnovo to the See of the Vicar of Jesus Christ," he saw how long and demanding the journey had been. In that moment, he sensed that his work was drawing to a close. With tears of gratitude, he blessed God's providence and lifted his gaze with trust toward eternity.

Reflecting on this event reveals how profoundly Don Bosco lived Zephaniah's call to "seek the Lord... seek integrity... and seek humility."

For Don Bosco, seeking the Lord was never passive. It meant discerning God's presence in the young, the poor, and the ordinary events of each day. He did not rely on his own strength, choosing instead to root every decision in prayer, to read the signs of the times with faith, and to entrust his mission to God's providence.

Don Bosco's integrity shone in his unwavering fidelity to his mission, even when misunderstood, opposed, or exhausted. Zephaniah challenged Israel to stay true to God despite the many competing loyalties around them; Don Bosco answered that call by living a unified life. His zeal, holiness, and daily choices all flowed from one source: love for God and love for the young.

Humility, for Don Bosco, meant recognising that every good comes from God's grace, not from our own merits. Like Zephaniah, he believed humility opens the way to God's blessing. Don Bosco lived this truth daily, trusting that God could achieve great things through small, simple acts of love. The Basilica of Mary Help of Christians and the Salesian family now present in 137 countries stand as testimony to what God can accomplish through a humble peasant boy.

Today, we Salesians in Australia are few. Yet if we seek the Lord, seek integrity, and seek humility, God will continue to work through our weakness for the good of the young.

My dear parishioners, as we celebrate the feast of Don Bosco, I ask your prayers for the Salesian family that his sons and daughters may follow his example with fidelity and humility.
